Dormitory Additional Application Guide

※ As Ewha is increasing offline classes starting from November and as the government is taking into consideration of easing COVID-19 quarantine measures (implementation of "With Corona"), the Housing Office is receiving additional applicants on the dormitory assignment policy of Fall 2021 which is single occupancy for single and twin rooms and double occupancy for triple and quad rooms.

* Please read the guide thoroughly before you apply not to miss any information and get disadvantages

* As the national policies change accordingly to the situation of the pandemic in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19, the housing office will also update the dormitory policies and check-in restrictions on a real time basis. Please check the housing office's website frequently for up-to-date announcements.

Fall 2021 Dormitory Policies under COVID-19

The Central Disaster Safety and Countermeasure Headquarters of Ewha has took into consideration of the current situation and put much effort in securing the right to study of students and the health of all dormitory residents. To conclude, Ewha has decided to manage the dormitory for Fall 2021 as follows:

- 1) Single occupancy for single or double rooms, double occupancy for triple or quad rooms, and
- 2) Students who live within commuting distance in a day are **NOT** eligible for Fall housing applications

- According to the above rules and taking into consideration of increased offline classes from November and the possibility of lifting COVID-19 regulations by the government, Ewha has decided to additionally assign students to vacant rooms or rooms that are currently assigned as single occupancy but are subjected to double occupancy:: single occupancy for single or double rooms and double occupancy for triple or quad rooms.
- Please apply after deliberation since various situations - both desirable and undesirable - can occur when living with a roommate; during room assignment, there is a possibility of getting assigned at a triple or quad room which is subjected to double occupancy.
- Also, refrain from applying for the dormitory if you are entirely taking online classes for Fall 2021, having no need to come to school to participate in classes.

The housing office mandates ALL RESIDENTS of Fall 2021 to submit PCR test negative results during check-in. We appreciate your cooperation as such are preventive measures for the sake of health of all residents at the dormitory.

Above all, housing policies for Fall 2021 are subjected to change depending on the severity of COVID-19. Please check the housing website frequently for the most up-to-date announcements.

0. Notes for application and assignment procedure

1. Lottery Process: Computerized assignment based on room availability and information on applications
 - ※ If the number of applicants for a specific room type exceeds the number of vacancies, it is likely that the students can be assigned to other room types available regardless of the information on the application
 - ※ If you want to be assigned **only** to the room type you applied for, select "NO" for the question "Do you agree that assignments can be made to available spaces and roommates and your preferences may not be able to be accommodated?"
2. How to apply and check room assignments: Please read the attached file #2. "기숙사 지원방법안내문" and note that **you can apply through EUREKA only during the application dates.**
3. E-House is for freshmen who are newly incoming (getting adjusted) to Ewha. After assigning freshmen, current undergraduate students can apply for the remaining rooms.
4. I-House is for exchange and language center students and there may be male residents in the same building (but different floor).
5. E-House is a suite-style dormitory with single/double/triple/quad rooms in 2-10 person suites. The number of people assigned means the number of people allocated per room, not per unit.
6. Please apply for the dormitory after full deliberation as there can be discomfort caused by noises, differences in personality, age, nationality, living patterns and so on with other residents. The dormitory is a place where you live and share your everyday life with other residents, so please take this into account while applying.
7. Please be aware that the assigned room/dormitory/residence option cannot be changed for personal preference.
8. Additional room assignment will take place due to increasing offline classes and possibility of alleviation of COVID-19 quarantine regulations by the government. There can be roommates for triple and quad room residents and applicants so take into consideration of the possibility of having roommates when applying. If a resident gets a roommate, residents cannot change their room types or dormitory.
9. Due to repair and maintenance, residents of E-House Bldg. 202 & some unit residents of Bldg. 300 will be subjected to changing dormitory buildings and rooms (in E-House) during Winter 2021 after their residences for Winter 2021 have been confirmed.
10. **Since internet connection will be used simultaneously used by multiple people over the same internet line, you may experience data disconnection while you use Wi-Fi when participating in online classes so please take this into account when applying for the dormitory**
11. If an applicant takes leave of absence, is academically dismissed, the housing office may revoke your dormitory application and you cannot re-apply for dormitory for the semester. Also, you have a duty to notify the housing of any changes in your status. Otherwise, you will be evicted and cannot re-apply.
12. Residents evicted due to accumulated demerit points cannot re-apply for dormitory

4. 2021 Fall Housing Fee

In accordance with the occupancy plan (1 person for single/double rooms & 2 person for triple/quad rooms), housing fees have been entirely adjusted; single and double room residents being charged of housing fees of single or single (disabled) rooms for and triple and quad room residents being charged of housing fees of double or double (big) rooms. The fees will vary among dormitories.

5. COVID-19: Important Announcements

※ Due to the evolving COVID-19 situation, important housing dates and policies are subject to change with guidance from the government and the university. Please check the housing website frequently for the most up-to-date announcements.

1. The housing office will monitor body temperatures of all students upon their check-in and if one's body temperature is over 37.5℃ or have any respiratory symptoms, his or her entry to the dormitory will be denied. If there are any residents who have encountered a person diagnosed with COVID-19 infections, he or she can check in at the dormitory only when he or she does not have any symptoms and when at least 14 days have passed from the encounter.
2. All students arriving from abroad must complete 14 days of self-quarantine at off-campus facilities and check in to dormitory only when the COVID-19 test results issued within 5 days of the check-in date (including weekends and holidays) stating negative are submitted. There are no exceptions for those who have completed vaccination.
3. If you are infected with COVID-19 during your residency at the dormitory and moved to the residential treatment center or facilities operated by the government, you can return to the dormitory only when you suffice the following:
 - 1) The dormitory can ask for additional self-quarantine if necessary at the on-campus quarantine facility even if you have negative results for COVID-19 after being released from the residential treatment center
 - 2) You must submit a letter confirming your release from isolation ('격리해제 확인서' in Korean) and a COVID-19 PCR test negative result

However, if you have been infected with COVID-19 while not abiding by the COVID-19 quarantine regulations, you will be evicted for good.
4. Please abide by the hygiene rules such as wearing face masks in shared spaces in order to prevent any outbreaks or spread of infections and refrain from visiting high-risk facilities or multiuse facilities where massive infections can occur.
5. Report to the housing office IMMEDIATELY if you have any symptoms of COVID-19 or fever (over 37.5 degrees Celsius), have contacted a person who was infected in any way. Afterwards, inform the Seodaemungu local health center as well and take tests.
6. Any visitors - Ewha students living in another residence hall, Ewha students living off-campus, family members or significant others - are NOT PERMITTED to enter the dormitory, even on the official check-in / check-out date. When any violation is detected, the student will be evicted.
7. If students are planning to visit abroad during their residential period under extenuating situations, they must report to the housing office in advance and go through 14 days of self-quarantine after arrival at an off-campus facility. When not abiding by such rules, the student will be evicted.
8. Going out or staying out overnight can be limited or forbidden in accordance with the social distancing measures during Fall 2021. Moreover, although you earn permission to stay out overnight, you will be obliged to submit

negative results of the COVID-19 test according to the days you have spent out of the dormitory. Please refer to the dormitory office's online announcement on policies regarding going out or staying out overnight: [\(link\)](#)

9. All students are required to submit online health survey every day during their residential period via Google forms by every midnight, checking their body temperature. Please check the online health survey link (QR code) on the housing website or on the bulletin board at your residence hall. If they do not submit the health survey on any day, they will get demerit points.
10. As the dormitory is classified as a high-risk facility according to the measures in prevention of the spread of the pandemic in the metropolitan area, the housing office may require COVID-19 tests (self-test kits, PCR test) as a prevention method.

6. Required Documents for Check-in

- ※ 2021-Fall Check-in Guide: Will be posted on the housing website in the third week of August
- ※ Erase the last 6 digits of your ARC number when submitting documents including it
- ※ In case any document is missing or insufficient, students will be denied to move in to dormitory.
Please make sure to prepare all documents and submit them upon your check-in.

1. COVID-19 Test Result (Negative):

Tests conducted within 5 days from the check-in date (Including weekends and holidays) is only valid

- A. All Fall 2021 residents must submit a "negative" result of PCR test in a printed version upon check-in.
Students can also print a screenshot of the text message that notifies their COVID-19 test results.
(e.g. If you are checking in on November 1st, tests conducted and results issued from October 27th are only valid.
When counting the dates, include weekends and holidays)

2. Chest X-ray (Tuberculosis test) certificate (Korean/English) - Issued from 2021. 7. 26(Mon)

- A. Submit original copy of chest x-ray (tuberculosis) certificate only. Receipts showing that you have paid for the test are not valid - the document should show the results of the test, state that you are clear of tuberculosis and should be written by a doctor. The document should be written in either Korean or English.

3. Proof of Residence - Issued from 2021. 7. 26(Mon)

- A. Domestic residents: A certificate of resident registration under your name
- B. Overseas Koreans: A proof of your foreign residence under your name
- C. In case parents live abroad and a student lives in Korea: A proof of parents' foreign residence, a certificate of family relations
- D. In case of international students: a copy of your passport or an alien registration card

4. Certificate of entry & exit - should cover from 2021. 7. 26(Mon) to 1 day before your check-in

* Print/get the document on the 'Government 24' website or visit a community service center on the day of your check-in.

- A. If you are a Korean citizen or are a registered foreigner with an ARC: Print out a certificate of entry & exit at Community Service Center (주민센터) and submit upon your check-in
- B. If you do not have an alien registration card: Submit your passport and flight ticket
- C. You must submit your flight ticket on your check-in date if you arrived in Korea anytime from 2021. 7. 26(Mon)
(The housing office will check the most recent flight ticket to Korea)
