## Student guide on taking Hybrid Modeled courses (Fall semester 2020)

### **Basic Principle**

As a response to the current circumstance of social distancing Level 1 stage, Ewha will be running multiple models of courses in the fall semester 2020.

Theory, Theory&Practice Courses	Courses with 50 or more registered students ⇒ ONLINE Courses with less than 50 registered students ⇒ HYBRID
Practice Courses	HYBRID MODEL  (Offline class can be scheduled according to the course characteristics.  For further details refer to the syllabus)

### What is Hybrid Modeled course?

- Professors give lectures in the assigned classroom, while online class is provided (simultaneous live streaming of the on-site lectures or post-class upload of recorded video/audio file, etc.).
- Students choose their choice of class model either to attend (and participate) online or offline. Refer to the following page for further details.
- · Your choice of either taking the class online or offline will not affect your attendance or grades.

# How are "less than 50 registered students" in theory, theory & practice courses decided?

It will be decided by the number of students registered in the course, during the course registration period\* in the Summer vacation.

\*Undergraduate: 17:00 Fri. August 14, Graduate: 17:00 Thurs. August 20

Even if the number of registered students change during the course add and drop period, class model will not be affected by the changed number.

- Ex 1) If 49 students registered initially, then it is decided as Hybrid model
  - ⇒ 55 students registered during the course add and drop period, it stays as Hybrid model,
- Ex 2) If 55 students registered initially, then it is decided as online class
  - ⇒ 49 students registered during the course add and drop period, it stays online class.

### Can the class model of Theory, Theory&Practice courses be changed?

Hybrid modeled courses are conducted offline *and* online. However, for the purpose of effective teaching and learning to which professor and students *both* come to an agreement, the class model can be changed *after consensus is reached and approved by the Dean of the College*.

\* In the case of changing to offline class, it can only be done within the capacity of classrooms.

Ex) List of possible class models:

Offline only or online only for all students (whole semester) /

Alternative day-to-day, by-weekly or by-half semester / Taught by groups, etc.

### How to choose the class model(offline/online) of Hybrid modeled courses?

Students can choose how they wish to participate in hybrid modeled courses via MyEureka. We will be opening the menu after the course registration is completed.

First round

approx. within
2 days
after the course
registration period
is over

Students choose how they wish to participate in hybrid modeled courses in the eureka (offline or online).



To maintain the appropriate distance from each student who will be in the classroom, the classroom may be changed based on the number of students who have chosen to take the hybrid modeled courses offline.



Second round (Final) approx. within
7 days
after course add
and drop period
is over

Students can change their choice of class participation (offline online), or can choose how they wish to participate to the newly registered hybrid modeled courses.

You will have about a week to make a final choice. Within this period, you can experience both online and offline lectures, compare them, and finally decide which one you prefer the most. Professors will be informed not to include attendance records of this period to the final grade.

#### Important information

- After the Second (final) round, you cannot change your choice. Temporary switch (one time) may be
  possible only in the case of unavoidable circumstances (such as medical issues), when the professor
  approves.
- Classrooms may be changed based on the number of students who have chosen to take the course
  offline during the first round in the vacation. Therefore, the number of students who can change to
  offline during the second round can be restricted on first come first served. It is due to the limited
  number of classroom capacities and to protect everyone's safety and disinfection.
